- An integrative program initiated in 2019
- The program is highly interdisciplinary and focus on the Asia-Pacific region, and the basic learning outcomes include the following:
 - Ability to research and master the development of professional trends
 - Capable of transnational political, economic, social and cultural academic research
 - Ability to use theoretical methods, comprehensive analysis, logical reasoning and thesis writing
 - Ability to integrate multiple values in the international community and integrate issues
 - Ability to have a regional presence and independently conduct research and teaching
- Students can apply their skills in governments, universities, research institutes, industries, and international non-profit organizations post-graduation, depending on their career aspirations

The Ph.D. Program in APRS

Adviser

- A general adviser is assigned when the student first enrolls in the Program
- Before the second semester, the student has to choose the adviser
- Graduation Credit
 - 28 course credits, including compulsory courses 13 credit hours and elective courses 15 credit hours
- A fulfilled Ph.D. dissertation is required







The Ph.D. Program in APRS

- Candidacy Examination and Dissertation Proposal Review Meeting
 - the student has to pass preliminary examination to become a Doctoral Candidate
 - The examination and the review meeting will be arranged by the adviser and the doctoral committee

Publications

 The student has to publish at least two journal articles or conference papers (full text required) related to their research topic under the auspices of the "Ph.D. Program in Asia-Pacific Regional Studies, National Dong Hwa University" prior to graduation

Admissions The Ph.D. Program in APRS

Application Period

There are two admission applications for international students each year

- 2023 Fall semester
 - study beginning in **2023 September**
 - 1st Round application: January 2-March 15, 2023
 - 2nd Round application: March 16-April 14, 2023
- 2024 Spring semester
 - study beginning in **2024 February**
 - The application: September 1-October 31





Admissions The Ph.D. Program in APRS

- Applicant Eligibility for the Ph.D. Program in APRS
 - Individuals who have a master's degree or equivalent to a master's degree recognized by the Program Director
 - English language proficiency:
 Applicants who are from non-native English-speaking countries require
 - A minimum TOEIC score of 700;
 - A minimum of TOEFL score of 71 for iBT, 197 for CBT, and 530 for PBT/ITP;
 - A minimum IELTS overall band score of 5.0.







Admissions The Ph.D. Program in APRS

- Applications are all processed online. And applicants shall upload the required documents below:
 - Color ID photo
 - Proof of nationality
 - Academic credentials in Chinese or English
 - Full transcript of records (including explanation of grading system)
 - Autobiography
 - Study Plan
 - Language Proficiency Certificates
 - Recommendation Letters
 - Financial statement
 - Other materials that benefit the application
